

# UNDERSTANDING THE CRIME LOG

The disposition on a criminal record is the current status or final outcome of an arrest or prosecution. If a case is assigned for follow up from a detective, it remains active until the final outcome of the case. Not all cases are sent to detectives. Cases are closed at supervisor approval.

## List of dispositions:

- ACT – Active
- CAA – Cleared adult, arrest (one incident)
- CAM – Cleared adult, arrest (multiple cases)
- CJA – Cleared juvenile, arrest (one incident)
- CJM – Cleared juvenile, arrest (multiple cases)
- CLO – Closed case
- CAN – Cleared, no arrest
- ECD – Cleared adult, death of offender
- ECP – Cleared adult, prosecution declined
- ECV – Cleared adult, victim uncooperative
- EJD – Cleared juvenile, death of offender
- EJN – Cleared juvenile, no custody
- EJP – Cleared juvenile, prosecution declined
- EJV – Cleared juvenile, victim uncooperative
- ESB – Exceptional (student behavior)
- INA – Inactive
- INF – For information only
- TRA – Transferred
- UNF – Unfounded
