Engage in <u>thoughtful</u> and <u>constructive</u> discourse

Voice your opinion while <u>respecting</u> the rights of others

T'NOC

Be <u>physically violent</u> or threaten <u>violence</u>

Obstruct egress or operations

Cause damage to property

UNLAWFUL PROTEST

- Intentionally blocking entrances, stairwells, or corridors
- Intentionally obstructing or seriously impairing sponsored/authorized activities
- Intruding upon a private office or entering a room/meeting space without approval (trespass)
- Being disruptive immediately outside of rooms occupied for classes, study, and research

- Using signs indoors, supported by standards or sticks
- Intentionally creating a noise disturbance that interferes with sponsored/authorized activities
- Violence or threats of violence against people or property
- Using amplified sound or music without a proper permit
- Camping on University of Utah property

POLICY 6-400: STUDENT RIGHTS & RESPONSIBILITIES



CONSEQUENCES FOR STUDENTS, FACULTY, STAFF, AND COMMUNITY MEMBERS COULD INCLUDE:

- **Students:** University discipline ranging from probation to suspension, and criminal trespass and disorderly conduct charges
- **Faculty and staff:** University discipline including up to termination, and criminal trespass and disorderly conduct charges
- Community members: Criminal trespass and disorderly conduct charges

If tents go up or unlawful occupancy or trespass occurs, we will enforce the law.
